For example, Fish Family Farm had sent ice cream and Munsons Chocolate had donated chocolate bars.

Additional Information: The centers were started before Sustainable CT, inspired by residents in need of electricity, cooling, warmth, food, water, etc, during a weather event. They might date back to the blizzard of 1976. What Sustainable CT did inspire is our advertising the events through Everbridge, social media, and our website notifications, as well as putting the center locations on our website.
