Objective

Learn from and share with other municipalities participating in Sustainable CT. Mentor or be mentored by another town to promote collaboration and sharing of best practices.

Complementary Action:

• Collaborate with Other Municipalities on Sustainability Actions

What to Do

1. Mentor to, or seek a mentorship with, other towns on implementation of specific Sustainable CT actions. To receive points, your municipality must demonstrate some meaningful role in mentoring to, or seeking advice from, another town(s) on action implementation. Mentoring towns can be outside of the region or state. A meaningful role of the mentor town might include: a presentation and interactive discussion about the action implementation to a committee or governing body of another town, or municipal staff time in assisting another town. Mentorship must be targeted and deliberate. For example, presenting at a conference or webinar attended by other municipalities, though worthy and important, is not eligible for points under this Action. A town can earn points for serving mentor/mentee partnerships resulting in implementation of up to three Sustainable CT actions per application. Mentor/mentee partnerships must have been active in the last three years. (5 points for each action collaborated on, up to 15 points)

Submit: A completed <u>worksheet 1</u>. Support given or received for each Sustainable CT action implemented must be documented separately (up to three entries per worksheet).

Engaging Partners

Sustainable CT encourages regional collaboration and other forms of partnership. For every action, please complete the "Partners" box in your submission, indicating the name(s) of any municipalities and/or organizations you partnered with (if any) and a brief description of your municipality's role. If you collaborate with other municipalities, each community will receive points. For additional information, please see the "Partners Guidance Document".

Potential Municipal and Community Collaborators

Councils of governments, health districts, and other regional organizations; municipal staff from all departments as well as representatives from existing local commissions, committees, or community organizations; civic leaders, representatives from neighborhood organizations, seniors and youth; and community members who rely on or are impacted by public services and amenities, including transportation, built infrastructure, local municipal operations, planning, natural resources, land conservation, economic development and retention, housing, arts and culture, food systems, public health, community engagement, equity, etc. may be helpful in implementing this action.
