These provision have been used many times resulting in less parking being built. A recent example has been provided (Effective Parking Management example) Section 5.6.9. Access and Parking, subsection c Parking (within South Windsor Center zone) offers a blended rate of parking and allows the Commission to reduce parking even more when demonstrated that it is not needed based on uses proposed.
