The school-based equity teams meet monthly around "Culturally Responsive Teaching and the Brain" by Zaretta Hammond with Dr. Tamika LaSalle-Finley, Georgia State University (formerly at UCONN). Through these meetings, the administrators and teachers prepare to conduct the equity professional development sessions.

Additional Information: The Hamden Economic Development Corporation (HEDC) is an independent, 501(c)(4) Corporation that serves as an additional tool for developing the tax base in Hamden and as an advocate for businesses in Town. The Corporation was formed as part of Hamden's long-range Economic Development Plan and is focused on redevelopment of contaminated or under-performing properties. Town of Hamden supported a budget line item for HEDC to cover insurance, marketing, and preliminary assessment costs. The Board of Directors is comprised of eleven members, including business, banking, utility and institutional partners. HEDC facilitated work on expanded inventory information conducted by students at UConn Department of Engineering as part of practicum. Notably, HEDC managed the remediation of CT's largest contaminated residential neighborhood in the Highwood neighborhood in Hamden. Also redeveloped by HEDC with town support, The Business Incubator project is located across the street from the redeveloped Villano Park in the Highwood neighborhood.
