Sustainable CT and Supporting Organizing Work-CT announce the creation of the Social Change Amplifier Fund

Supporting Organizing Work-CT (SOW-CT) has established the Social Change Amplifier Fund within Sustainable CT's Community Match Fund to dedicate matching funds to projects led by Black, Latinx,

Multiracial, Indigenous and other POC community

organizers and organizations. Sustainable CT will match up to \$7,500 in one-to-one dollars from the Social Change Amplifier Fund. Unlike traditional grant programs, Sustainable CT offers a quick, simple application process (starting with a conversation) with no deadlines, no lengthy review period, and minimal






