Five Communities Achieve Prestigious Sustainable CT Certification

Congratulations Guilford, Lyme, Southbury, Coventry and Vernon

We're excited to report that **five towns** qualified for certification during the 2022 spring submission cycle.



Guilford, Lyme and

Southbury all met high standards in a broad range of sustainability accomplishments to qualify for bronze-level certification. Coventry and Vernon achieved silver-level certification, the highest level of certification currently offered.

Seventeen municipalities submitted paperwork for the Spring 2022 certification cycle; of those, four towns submitted only for review...
