\$875M Available to Underserved Communities

The Department of Economic and Community Development will administer The Community

Investment Fund 2030 (CIF) to foster economic development in historically underserved communities across the state. CIF will provide a total of up to \$875 million to eligible municipalities as well as not-for-profit organizations and community development corporations that operate within them. Grants are available for capital improvement and small business capital programs.

Governor Announces \$7.5M in State Grants to Preserve Open Space and Renew Green Spaces in **Urban Areas**

Governor Ned Lamont announced that his administration is releasing \$7.29 million in state funds to purchase and protect 1,013 acres of open space in 17 Connecticut communities, and \$276,200 to restore and renew of green spaces in 6 urban areas. The funds are provided through the state's Open Space and Watershed Land Acquisition Grant Program and the Urban Green and Community Gardens Grant Program, which are both administered by the Connecticut Department of Energy and Environmental Protection (DEEP).

June Bloom: \$100k **Investment in** Connecticut Neighborhoods Connecticut neighborhoods and towns are stepping into a summer full of activities and projects thanks in part to Sustainable CT's Community Match Fund. From June 1 to July 1, the Community Match Fund partnered with seven project leaders to raise nearly \$100k (\$53k from donors and \$43k from Sustainable CT).
